Founded in 1985, Christ Presbyterian Academy is a parochial, coeducational college preparatory school for students in grades Preschool-12. Serving a student body with a diversity of both academic abilities and socioeconomic backgrounds, the Academy emphasizes small classes, student-faculty interactions, and a commitment to help students develop academic and personal skills in a supportive Christian environment. The Academy is a ministry of Christ Presbyterian Church (PCA). Typically, 98 percent of graduates attend four-year colleges and universities. The remaining students will choose to defer college admission for a year in order to pursue mission work or alternative learning experiences.

## ACADEMIC INFORMATION

- CPA offers a college preparatory curriculum and operates on a semester schedule. Seven academic periods comprise the school schedule, and students are required to take six courses each semester.
- Courses are offered at three levels: College Preparatory, Honors (H), and Advanced Placement (AP). Honors and AP classes are designated on the transcript. Student selection for these courses is based upon successful completion of prerequisite courses, teacher recommendations, overall academic performance, and standardized test scores.
- All courses receive a letter grade with the exception of Freshmen Bible Intern (FBI), (a leadershipdevelopment program open to select seniors), and Fitness. Students in these courses may receive marks of Pass/Fail.
- CPA only assigns numerical rank to students in the spring semester of their senior year for the purpose of naming the Valedictorian and Salutatorian.


## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To receive a diploma, students must complete 24 academic credits, distributed across disciplines as indicated below.
Courses taken in middle school that are also offered in upper school (Algebra I, Spanish I, e.g.) are listed on the upper school transcript but do not count toward credit requirements.

ENGLISH: 4 Credits Required
MATHEMATICS: 4 Credits Required
SCIENCE: 3 Credits Required (All Sciences are lab-based)
SOCIAL STUDIES: 3 Credits Required
COMPUTER: 0.5 Credits Required
Students have the opportunity to take a computer proficiency course in order to be exempt from taking a formal computer course at CPA.
WORLD LANGUAGE: 2 Credits Required (in the same language) In order to expand our world language offerings, students may take courses online in French and Chinese. The online curriculum is provided to the students via an accredited institution (Sevenstar for 2019-2020) and includes reading, writing, speaking and listening. Grades are earned through the accredited online institution and students are monitored by a CPA faculty member.

## AP TEST HIGHLIGHTS

In 2019, 172 students took 344 Advanced Placement exams in 16 disciplines. Of those 172 students, $84 \%$ received at least one score of 3 or higher and $73 \%$ earned passing scores on each test they took. Of the 344 exams, the score breakdown was as follows:
